## SUCCESS! WE ARE BEGINNING TO “MAKE ALL THINGS NEW”

Congratulations to all of the members and friends of our church. We did it! We have successfully completed the gift and pledging portion of “Making All Things New: Phase One”. At our Annual Congregational Meeting on May 21, we voted to proceed with a campaign to raise \$32,000 to repair the stained glass windows in the sanctuary. With pledge and gift responses totaling \$32,200 at this time, we will sign a contract with Staige Stained and Leaded Glass Restoration to make the necessary repairs as soon as they can in 2024.

Thank you to all those who made pledges or contributions toward the campaign. The work must be done, and while we might wish for a better, easier time to take care of things - sometimes difficult times make us work a little harder and stand a little stronger. There will always be challenges on the horizon. Sometimes it will be issues like the physical needs of our beautiful facility, other times we may face issues we haven't even dreamed of! We believe that God has kept this congregation alive and vibrant through 125 years of ministry for a reason; God has more ministry in store for us today and tomorrow.

Once again, we thank the members of the Capital Campaign Planning Team: Bill Bond, Carolyn Heatwole, Jeanne Mantsch, Joe Mueller, Karen Oftedahl, and Ray Shupe, as well as the members of the Property Team: Claude Zimmerman, Gary Tackes, Bill Bond, and Joe Mueller for the work that went into making the campaign a success. Please know that if you would still like to contribute to this campaign, any additional funds will be placed in a new “Building Fund” dedicated to repair and maintenance of the church building.

## HELP FIGHT INVASIVE TEASEL IN CREEKSIDE COMMONS ON SATURDAY MORNING, AUGUST 5

Please come lend a hand in removing teasel on Saturday morning, August 5, starting at 8:30. It was back in August of 2021 that Jane Spalding took notice of an invasive species that was quickly taking over the Creekside Commons area. That first summer a small group gathered and cut down hundreds of plants and took them over to the city disposal site. We all learned that teasel is a very aggressive plant, grows to a height of over 8 feet, and sends seeds out by the thousands. It will take over prairie and grassland areas if left unchecked. Because of its multi-year life cycle, we knew it would be back again for several years. Last summer, another group gathered to remove the plants, there were still hundreds, but probably only half as many as the first year. And now, in year three, we have made a real difference because this summer there are only dozens of plants! Please help us continue tackling this invasive plant.

We were proud to send high school junior Taylor Ulicki on her way to work on a Mission Trip with members of Pilgrim UCC in Grafton last month. Taylor and Josh Jacque attended a Mission Trip to Appalachia in July of 2022 with Pastor Scott. This year, Taylor was our congregation’s only representative to travel with the annual mission trip group from Pilgrim. They chose an urban setting and worked with the Urban Mission Experience in St. Louis. The UME started in 2006 by a group of experienced mission trip leaders in the United Church of Christ. The program is hosted at Epiphany UCC, a small but mighty faith community in the Benton Park neighborhood of St. Louis.

We are very fortunate that Taylor and members and leaders of Pilgrim UCC will worship with us on August 20 to share highlights and lessons learned from their week-long mission experience. We will learn more about UME’s ministry and perhaps inspire our high school youth to participate in a mission trip next summer! We are so fortunate to have talented members and friends that make our ministry happen in our church.

## CHURCH COUNCIL MEETS ON AUGUST 10

The Church Council took the month of July off, as they do each year. The new Council, with select members elected at the annual Spring Congregational Meeting this past May, will meet on August 10. The Council, which holds meetings on the second Thursday evening of each month, gathers in person with an option for attending virtually through Zoom. This has allowed our busy Council members to attend meetings from home, while away on business trips, and even from the parking lot of their child's rehearsal or practice. Meetings usually last about an hour and a half.

The Executive Team, comprised of the Moderator, Associate Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and Pastor, meets on the first Thursday evening of the month and puts together an agenda for the Council. The Council always shares a devotion at the beginning of the meetings and end every meeting with prayer. Each Team Representative has an opportunity to share the events and activities of their ministry area. 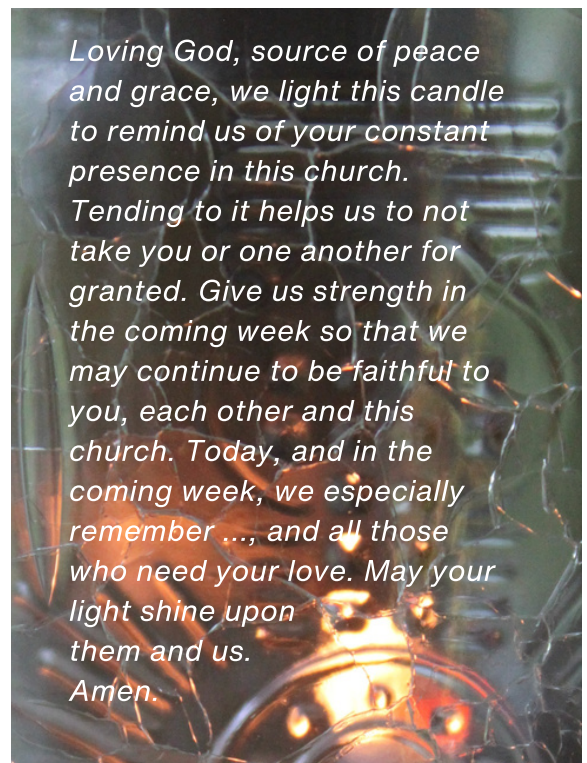


## SPECIAL THANKS TO KARL PRADEL - LIGHTING THE CHRIST CANDLE

## THEMES FOR WORSHIP IN AUGUST

**August 6: Genesis 32:22–31    Matthew 14:13–21**

*10th Sunday after Pentecost, Communion Sunday*

The Genesis text has Jacob wrestling with an angel, while Jesus is challenged to feed a multitude with a few loaves and fish in the gospel of Matthew. We come to the Communion Table to consider the ways we are blessed and how we might share those blessings with our neighbors.

**August 13: Genesis 37:1–4, 12–28    Matthew 14:22–33**

*11th Sunday after Pentecost*

Today's texts include the story of Joseph as he is lifted from a pit into an unknown future, and the Gospel of Matthew has Peter attempting to walk on water. The theme of faith and faithfulness will be lifted, as we seek to trust in God and follow God's plan.

**August 20: Genesis 25:19–34    Matthew 13:1–9, 18–23**

*12th Sunday after Pentecost*

The Genesis story of rival twins, invites us to examine the things that divide us, and a parable about seeds sown in a variety of places along the path provides an opportunity to reflect on our spiritual growth.

**August 27: Genesis 28:10–19a    Matthew 13:24–30, 36–43**

*13th Sunday after Pentecost, Baptism of Cora Manderscheid*

The story from Exodus is one of cunning midwives, a courageous mother, and a vigilant sister-- providing examples of what it means to act and to live our faith in response to God's call. We might ask, "Where in today's world is the church called to such acts of courage, defiance, and faithful action?"



## Church Team Spotlight

### OUR PASTOR PARISH RELATIONS (PPR) TEAM

Summer greetings from the Pastor Parish Relations Team (PPR). You may wonder, what is a Pastor Parish Relations Team? How do we serve our church? Believe it or not, you can enter this very question into the Google search engine and the following definition will arrive. "The pastoral relations committee (or team) supports and maintains an open relationship between the minister and members of the congregation. It helps the minister and the members of the church to share ideas, hopes, dreams and interpretations of mission". We here at First Congregational would add to that definition by saying "The PPR team helps facilitate the direct and open communications between members and our minister with a goal of helping both parties feel as comfortable as possible when difficult issues need to be addressed". This type of team can be most useful when new ministers join a long standing congregation, which is precisely why our team exists.

Our PPR team, in addition to supporting congregational needs, has been spearheading the creation of a Pastoral Evaluation process for our church. Just as many of us experience in our own professions, a well rounded evaluation includes both a self assessment as well as an evaluation by others. Through this process, areas of success as well as areas of improvement are identified. Goals and objectives then follow to help set the course forward.

The UCC provides guidance on the creation of pastoral evaluations, and there are several publications which highlight the delicate nature in which a pastoral evaluation should be considered. Our team has been hard at work reading and considering these resource materials to help guide us forward. We have created a rough draft of the evaluation, which we will be fine tuning throughout the next few weeks. The hope is to be ready to begin our first annual evaluation process when the new program year begins next month.

Our PPR team currently consists of six members, including several who were on the Search Committee. This is by design, as it is recommended there is continuity between the hiring of a new minister and the establishment of the PPR team. Now that our team will be completing its third year, we encourage others to consider sharing their talents with the team. If you have interest in joining us, we encourage you to complete the Ministry Options Survey, and we will reach out to you.
