#### SUBMIT NAMES FOR ALL SAINTS SUNDAY



On Sunday, November 7, we celebrate All Saints Sunday. Together in prayer we remember all of those friends, family and church members who have died in the previous twelve months, recalling how, in New Testament usage, the word "saints" referred to Christians in general. It is the recognition of the common bond of Christians, both living and dead, and the common bond of the church here on earth and the church triumphant in heaven. It also recalls Hebrews 12:1 in which we are "surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses" as we continue in faithful discipleship.

During worship we would like to lift up the names of all those who have died in the last year and are known to our members and friends. Names will be printed in the bulletin as well as lifted by those in attendance. We would like to be able to list people's names, as well as the appropriate dates that mark their lifetime, and their relationship to our congregation. For instance, a friend of mine died this fall, and I would like to add him to our list of saints. So, I could send the office an email with the information: All Saints Sunday, Allen Zdroik, Dec. 8, 1964 - Sept. 28, 2021, friend of Scott McLeod. In order to include people in the bulletin, we would need their names by **Thursday, November 4th**. Thanks for your help in making this All Saints Sunday a meaningful worship experience.



#### SEEKING LIGHTHOUSE YOUTH MINISTRY SUPPORT

As you probably already know, Lighthouse Youth Ministry is a shared ministry of five congregations from three denominations in Saukville and Port Washington. These five churches joined forces in 2018 to establish Lighthouse because we all saw the need for a vibrant Christian group which welcomes youth grades 5-12 of all faith backgrounds. The idea has been that together we could all seek to create a welcoming and safe community where youth could grow in their relationships with God and with each other. As you can imagine the pandemic has been very difficult for this new youth ministry program to manage; the challenges are unprecedented. At the October meeting of the Lighthouse Board it was announced that the youth director, Erica Brooks, was resigning (but will serve in the position into December). The Board is currently making sure Lighthouse's mission and purpose are clear and will begin a search for a new youth director soon.

Right now, we are in need of two things - your financial support and two volunteers:

- First, in the next several weeks we will be asking for donations toward Lighthouse to complete our annual gift to the organization. We budgeted \$2,500 in 2021 toward Lighthouse's ministry and hope to raise an additional \$2,500 to fulfill our obligation before the end of the year. Please keep an eye out for more details about this project later in the month.
- Second, we are also looking for two of our church members or friends to step forward to help with this important community ministry by serving on the Board of Directors. If you are interested in making sure Lighthouse is able to fulfil its mission of creating a safe and welcoming space for youth in the community, than we have an opportunity for you! Approval of the Minutes – August, 2021 – Kathy motions to approve the August minutes. Mike seconds the motion. The minutes are approved as they are printed.

<u>Financial Administrator's Overview of Giving (Kathy)</u> – Meeting mid September to go over next year's budget. Lorraine is reaching out to committee heads. Lorraine has concerns for next year with PPP (Paycheck Protection Program/Covid 19 Relief) Funds coming to an end with this year. Expenses are in line and fine. It's Revenue or lack of it, that is the concern. Bill is asking if line 46434 Donations to Memorial Funds and line 46435 Donations to Mission Fund on the operating budget belong under REVENUE or if they should be categorized under own revenue line as/like Port Pre-School.

#### **New Business**


Nominating Committee Formation – Council members agree this committee should be formed and will think about who should be elected for the committee.






The 2021/2022 program year begins on September 12, 2021. Do you plan to attend church in the coming weeks and at what time?





- Masks should be required when Co case numbers are high.


What would you do if masks were optional? 73 responses




