### **NEW MEMBER CLASSES THIS MONTH - JOIN US!**

On September 12 we will gather at 11:15 to spend some time getting to know one another, learning a little about the United Church of Christ; its history and traditions. Both classes will be held in the Dennett Room (off Fellowship Hall). ### **CONFIRMATION CLASS STARTS SEPTEMBER 13**

I am excited to be starting another year of Confirmation. This year's class of 8th Graders will be meeting approximately once a month for classroom instruction on the Bible, the ministry of Jesus Christ, the early church, the life of prayer, and our calling to discipleship (among other subjects!). Almost every month the class will have "Mission Experiences" that help them develop the habit of "putting faith into action" and encourage their spiritual life as well. Whether helping at the The Food Pantry here in Port Washington, walking the Stations of the Cross at Holy Hill, serving at Pilgrim Center or another charitable service provider, we hope that "praxis" (the combination of practice, reflection and learning) will help each of our Confirmands feel good about affirming the Baptismal vows their parents took for them when they were infants and joining our Congregation as adult members. Classes will begin on Monday evening, September 13, with a gathering of parents and 8th graders together in our Fellowship Hall from 6:30-8. The class will meet same time, same place on September 20.

### WEDNESDAY LUNCH GROUP STARTS SEPTEMBER 15

The Wednesday Lunch Group will be starting up again after its summer hiatus at noon on September 15. 
# Weaving Together Community

The UCC has a long history of working towards eradicating systemic and institutional racism. In 2003 a resolution was adopted calling for the UCC to be an anti-racist church stating that "racism is rooted in a belief of the superiority of whiteness and bestows benefits, unearned rights, rewards, opportunities, advantages, access, and privilege on Europeans and European descendants."

Sacred Conversations to End Racism (SC2ER), a Restorative Racial Justice Journey curriculum was created in 2018 to address and dismantle racism within the Christian Church and society. The study guide and resources offer lessons to dispel myths of white skin and dominant culture supremacy.

Reverend Laura McLeod, Senior Pastor of Brookfield Congregational UCC, Brookfield, WI will be our facilitator. She is a certified facilitator through national UCC for Sacred Conversations to End Racism.

According to the UCC Book of Worship, an Installation Service takes place when, "the association, at the request of a local church, confirms and celebrates the covenant between a local church and a newly called pastor and teacher and reaffirms the covenantal relationship of all the churches in the association."

An Installation Service is an official way to celebrate the successful conclusion of a pastoral search process, as well as affirm the relationship we have with all the UCC congregations in our area and the wider Wisconsin Conference.

Members of our Church Council and the Search Committee will be participating in the service, as well as Rev. Laura McLeod (Senior Pastor of Brookfield Congregational UCC and Pastor Scott's wife) who will be delivering a message along with Rev. Dr. Timothy Perkins (recently retired from Bethel-Bethany UCC in Milwaukee), and there will be representatives from the Wisconsin Conference and the Church and Ministry Team of the SE Association.

### LECTIONARY SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR SEPTEMBER WORSHIP

#### SEPTEMBER 2021: A Season of Creation

During the month of September we are stepping away from the "Revised Common Lectionary" in order to focus on the wonders of God's creation and our calling to be good stewards of God's gifts as we worship together. Each Sunday this month will focus in on a particular aspect of God's creation; including, the planet Earth, Humanity as part of Creation, the Sky and the Mountains. In October we will continue on with the regular Lectionary texts.

**September 5:** 15th Sunday after Pentecost, Planet Earth Sunday

Genesis 1:1-25, Psalm 33:1-9, Romans 1:18-23, John 1:1-14

On Planet Earth Sunday, we celebrate our identity as creatures of the Earth and the amazing reality that God, our Creator Spirit continues to express spiritual presence in the natural world.

**September 12:** 16th Sunday after Pentecost, Humanity Sunday

Genesis 1:26-28, Psalm 8, Philippians 2:1-8, Mark 10:41-45

Humanity Sunday, calls us to listen again for humanity's relationship with the Earth, with all of God's Creatures, and with the Creator. We are called to consider how humans do not always live with respect in Creation.

September 19: 17th Sunday after Pentecost, Sky Sunday

Jeremiah 4:23-28, Psalm 19:1-6, Philippians 2:14-18, Mark 15:33-39

An image of a world in which we are alone, where beauty is destroyed, and God's good Creation undone, startles us from complacency and calls us to take seriously the reality and danger of climate change.

September 26: 18th Sunday after Pentecost, Mountain Sunday

Isaiah 65:17-25, Psalm 48:1-11, Romans 8:28-39, Mark 16:14-18

Our September Season of Creation comes to a close with a vision of God's holy mountain; a vision that offers us a path of hope for the future and calls us to live justly and in partnership with God.



### UPDATES FROM OUR FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATOR

In February of this year the church received \$34,447 as part of the Payroll Protection Plan Loan. As we were able to substantiate that these funds went to our payroll expenses, appropriate documentation was recently sent to the Small Business Administration requesting loan forgiveness and that forgiveness has been granted. Therefore, these funds do not need to be repaid.

Last year we took out a low interest loan through the Cornerstone Fund to help pay for extensive window and bell tower repairs at the church. From Aug 2020 - Aug 2021, this was an interest only loan. On September 1, 2021, monthly loan payments in the amount of \$1,093 will begin for the next two years. Thank you to the Stewardship Team for fundraising most of this first payment by holding a Brat Fry in June.

Expenses and revenue continue to be in line with our normal patterns.

Our solution is to still publish the minutes of the Council meeting, but to push the publishing date back a month. The August 12th Council meeting minutes will appear in the October "Congregational Connections". The September 9th Council meeting minutes will appear in the November newsletter, and so on. It simply allows the Council to approve the minutes at the next regular Council meeting.

### CHRIS FRASER WISHES TO GO TO DISNEY FOR HIS 50th BIRTHDAY


One of our church members, Chris Fraser, invites us to visit a GoFundMe page that was set up to help him raise money to take a trip to Disney World this coming year.

Hello First Congregational Church,

Thank you for your support as I compete in the Paralympics in Tokyo! I always enjoy talking with my mom about weekly sermons and the importance of your community.

I wanted to give an update on my life. I am living in Gilbert, Arizona where I live with my partner and dogs. I work for a non-profit company Ability360 as a program specialist and recreational therapist. I get to help people with disabilities achieve independence and live healthy meaningful lives through the power of adaptive sports and recreation. I will finish my master's degree in December 2021 from Northwest Missouri State University in Recreational Therapy.

After the Rio Paralympics in 2016 competing in tennis, I tried a new sport, sprint kayak and canoe. I will be competing in this new sport in Tokyo. I have been training hard for the last two years, but the last twelve weeks have been more grueling than I could have ever imagined. I am excited to see what I can do on the world's biggest stage!

The Paralympics are held August 24th - September 5th. I will be racing on September 2nd, 3rd, and 4th. My races will be televised on September 2nd and 3rd. You can tune in on NBCSN between 9:00am - 3:00am.
