The Food Pantry in Port Washington was started in 1982 and is a 501(c) non-profit organization that receives financial contributions, nutritious supplemental food, clothing, and household items to give to those in need. It is the only pantry in the area that is totally staffed by volunteers. The pantry does not receive federal, state or local funding; they are 100% supported by individuals and groups in the community, especially local churches such as ours. Our church has had a Food Pantry cart at our entrance for many years, and have also participated in their Christmas gift program for children.

The pantry redistributes items on Tuesdays (9am-Noon and 4-6pm) to qualifying individuals and families primarily in Northern Ozaukee County. They currently serve an average of 75 families per week.

The Food Pantry is always recruiting volunteers for a variety of tasks. You may contact them directly to learn more.
