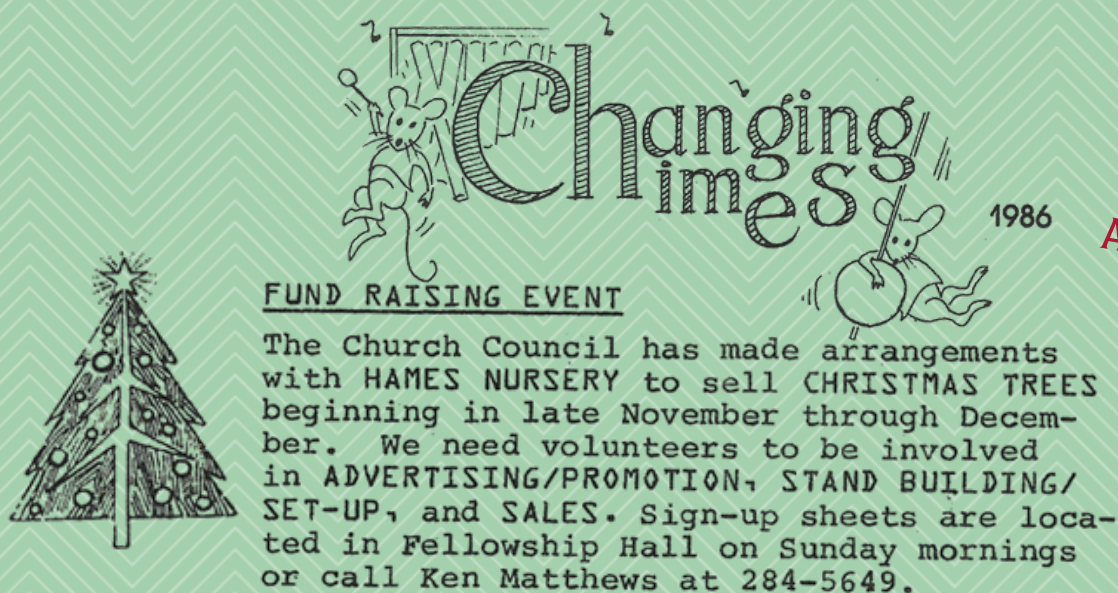

40TH ANNIVERSARY CHRISTMAS TREE SALE - THROUGH THE YEARS

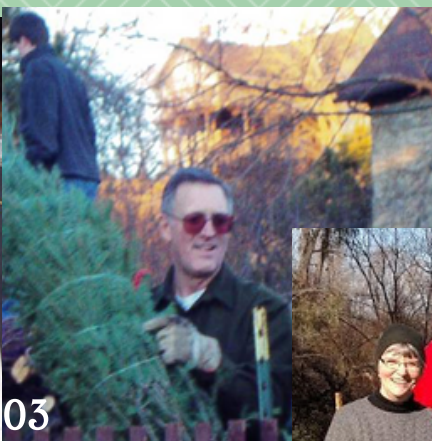


Who would have thought that when our Church Council voted on a Christmas Tree Sale Fundraiser back in 1986, that it would be alive and well today, 40 years later! In fact, we remain the only Christmas tree lot in Port Washington! For many years the sale took place within the fenced area to the south of the church (where there was a children's playground) and operated out of a little shed. It has moved to the street corner with the placement of our very own mobile trailer - with heat!

The trees have come from all over the state, and in recent years, we've worked with a supplier from Merrill. Up until eight years ago, a group from the church (mostly retired men) unloaded the trees. Now we leave the arduous work to Port Washington High School students who earn volunteer hours and pizza. You can imagine the effort of hundreds of volunteers over the years helping to coordinate and sell trees. Thank you to all of you who have, in one way or another, assisted with the sale - and to those who will be helping this year, and beyond!
